About CPTPP:

The Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP) gives access to ten countries around the Pacific Rim, many of which are prime targets for wheat exports. With a combined trading block representing 495 million people and a combined GDP of \$13.5 trillion, representing 13% of global GDP, there is enormous potential growth for Canadian exports, including wheat and other agricultural products.

The Issues:

- As one of the first six countries to sign the CPTPP, virtually all of the exports to the member countries are tariff free.
- Canadian growers and the transportation system need to ensure that we can quickly establish inroads into all of the wheat markets.
